






"DRINK IN YOUR HAND" CARBON FOOTPRINT

- Conserve resources through recycling & using recycled content





PACKAGING CARBON FOOTPRINT


















PET & HDPE Recycling

- Recycling symbols #1 & #2
- Highest recyclability potential of all plastics¹
- Most widely recycled plastics in the world¹
- PET is easily recycled into new bottles or other products such as clothing, insulation (fiberfill), furniture, carpet, and more

Mixed Plastics

- Much more difficult to recover
- Often unwanted in single-stream recycling
- Includes single-use plastics such as thin-film plastic packaging, plastic utensils, trash bags, cotton swabs, coffee cups, polystyrene, straws, and more

Recycling Plastics? Look for the Resin Identification Code (#1-#7)



SUSTAINING OUR COMMUNITIES

Piloting Local PET Capture & Reuse

Along with the few recyclables we captured at our International Coastal Cleanup; we also purchased bales of recycled PET from our Tampa Material Recovery Facility (MRF). This locally-recycled content was ground into flake, washed, and made into new rPET resin that was used to make new bottles and re-sold in the Tampa market



"The bottles and cans that we're collecting are valuable recyclables and we want them back – all of them."

"While our plastic bottles already contain some recycled material, we want to do more to reinforce the importance of recycling. So we're taking an extra step at this year's cleanup."

WORLD WITHOUT WASTE | MODEL MARKETS | Roadmap

We aim to recover the equivalent of the bottles and cans we sell in the market. We will begin by convening a local stakeholder group to design and execute the most impactful program. Program elements may include the following:

Advance Recycling Infrastructure

- Improve home recycling
- Expand multifamily access
- Offer citywide recycling bin grant
- Increase recycling on college campuses
- Optimize recycling processing facility

Inspire a Recycling Culture

- Lead with 100% diversion at facilities
- Launch a citywide recycling campaign
- Promote recycling at attractions & venues
- Encourage policy to drive recycling

Support Trash-Free Waterways

- Engage associates & others in cleanups
- Support infrastructure
 & education to prevent
 litter
- Fund waterway litter catchment systems
- Connect with replenish projects

Pilot Recycling & Packaging Innovation

- Pilot recycling kiosks
- Explore virtual incentives
- Secure recycled material for packaging & other products
- Trial increased recycled PET bottle
- Expand packageless delivery (e.g. DASANI PureFill & ValidFill)
